## Parking at The UFL...Still a Bargain!

The price of gasoline may sting, but library users can get some relief when it comes to parking at the library. Here's how:

- We apologize for the weekday meters, but they do maximize available spaces for VIP users—that's you!
- All parking spaces in the downtown Urbana area are 25¢ per hour!
- Parking on the library block is FREE evenings and weekends.
- Meters on the library block (5-hour limit) are enforced Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., including the meters on Elm Street.
- City of Urbana, Champaign, and UI CashKeys may be used in all meters.

Can't find a place to park in the library's Green Street parking lot? There are plenty of additional parking options:

- Busey Bank lot (available weekends and weekdays after 4:00 p.m.)
- City parking deck (located just one block to the east—paid parking enforced 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on weekdays)
- Cunningham Township lot (directly across Green Street—metered spaces enforced 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on weekdays)

If you can, think green and walk, bike, or bus to the library. It's good for your health, the environment, and our community quality of life. Racks are available for 44 bikes in the library's Green Street parking lot. But please, lock up your bike when you park!

Do you know about QR codes? Quick response (QR) codes are barcodes that represent the address of a website, which permit you to view a webpage on many mobile phones.

You will need a mobile phone with a camera and Internet access and a QR code reader application. Download a reader application (usually free) from your phone's app store and open it on your phone. Scan the QR code above and learn about **My Media Mall** and **Freegal**—downloadable services available through your library.

Don't let the heat and humidity get you down! Head to the library where books and programs are plentiful and the coffee chillers and smoothies at the library coffee shop are always refreshing.

After the completion of the building addition and remodel in 2005, the library added coffee service to quench the overwhelming thirst of the users who had requested it. Aside from the benefits to users, the presence of the library's coffee shop and its staff offer much, much more. It adds to the variety of businesses in the downtown district and is located in a popular community setting. It provides a place for the Friends of The Urbana Free Library to sell gently used books year-round and the library the ability to sell library gear to its loving fans. Most important, the presence of the coffee

shop permits the library to keep the historic Race Street entrance, an important connection to the downtown district, accessible during the 70 hours it is open each week.

Beginning in August, The Urbana Free Library will take over the operation of the coffee shop, but will continue to offer Latté Da! coffee and teas. If you regularly partake in the service—we thank you! If you've never heard of or tried the library coffee shop, we encourage you to do so. When you support the coffee shop, you simultaneously support the library.


