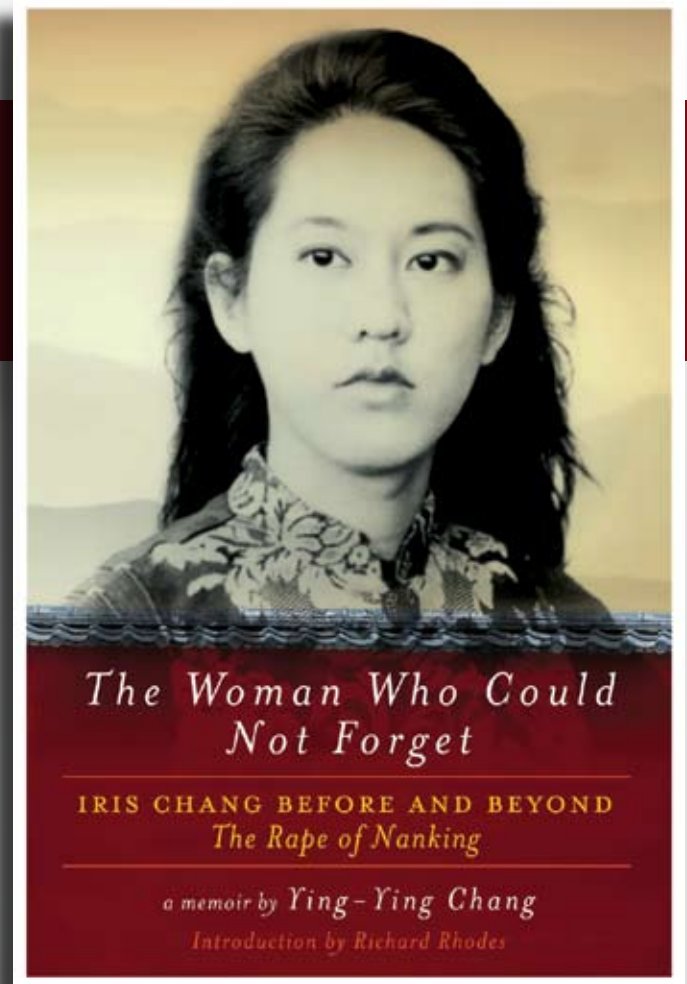

A scholar in her own right, Ying-Ying Chang offers in her memoir an intimate look at her daughter—from the homemade childhood newspapers created by Iris, to her years as a journalist and promising young historian, to her struggles with her son's autism and her tragic suicide.
