



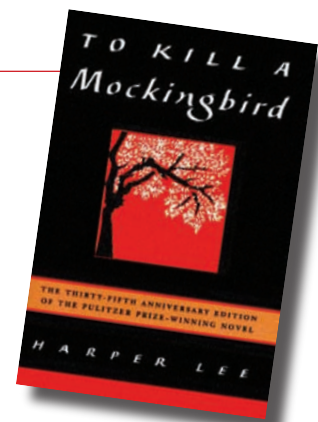
American Classics We Missed
